



**H2020/074 Matters Arising**  
None – all are included on the Agenda.

**H2020/075 Speed Indicator Devices**  
A scheme had previously been agreed which included the locations identified by the Parish Council back in 2017 when funding had been set aside to work in partnership with other rural parish councils.  
However, with increased costs and other restrictions there had been an unavoidable delay in bringing this partnership forward.  
The Clerk reported that an additional grant application has now been successful and this will enable Edgmond Parish Council to purchase its own Speed Indicator Device and six location posts. Funding will be required in the budget for the maintenance of the project and associated costs.  
The order will now be placed with TWC who will liaise on our behalf with Morelocks to provide the SID and Balfour Beatty to administer the rotation and downloads, as required.  
It was agreed that a press release will be issued to the Newport Advertiser when the first SID is operational.

**H2020/076 Highways & Transport**  
Residents are encouraged to report ‘requests for action’ such as potholes or uneven paths direct to TWC via My Telford. This generates a reference number which can be followed up if action is delayed.

A meeting regarding rural transport is awaited, hopefully this can take place in the New Year.

**H2020/077 Shrewsbury Road Car Park**  
TWC will provide the details of the new scheme, which will benefit from the £1000 from the Parish Council and £1000 from Councillor Bentley’s Ward Pride Fund. The revised scheme will not include a footpath at the front of the car park area.  
The provision of an electric car charging point will be considered at a later date, but a location will be included in the plan, in preparation.

**H2020/078 Street Lighting**  
There are four lights to be upgraded to LED, the Clerk will find out when this work will be completed.  
There are still areas of the Parish where the lights are not effective due to the overgrown trees and hedges.  
Western Power have now provided a detailed schedule of the lights which has meant that credit notes have been produced where the energy has been overcharged. It will now be possible to settle the outstanding invoices from last year so that the account is up to date.

**H2020/079 Road Safety**  
a) Community Speedwatch  
The Chairman updated Members with regards to the scheme which has not been operational due to the covid restrictions. The Marsh Road volunteers have confirmed that they are willing to undertake a trial scheme on the B5062 but no speedwatch will take place until the covid restrictions have been lifted.

- b) **Dog Fouling**  
The Parish Council is disappointed that there are still local dog walkers who do not pick up after their dogs. They are reminded that free dog poo bags are available from Edmond Shop (thanks to Pam and Paul) and that there are bins around the Parish if they are not able to take the bags home.  
It is a hazard to health, and people have lost their sight, as a result of dog poo being left in public places. It also carries a £1000 fine.  
Areas of extreme concern include The Church Field, Robin Lane and Shrewsbury Road Car Park and the recreational field areas.
- c) **Signage – B5062, Marsh Road and Longwithy Lane advance cross road signs**  
A request to TWC has added this to the Chairman’s Report which is under consideration by officers of TWC.
- d) **Car Parking in Shrewsbury Road**  
The police will be asked to visit and discuss the unacceptable parking habits when the football is taking place on the field.
- e) **Stanford Hall area**  
A request for a 30mph restriction has been forwarded to TWC for consideration.

**H2020/080 Any Other Matters**

**Inconsiderate Parking**

Concerns have been raised regarding the parking in Playdale, which results in parking on pavements and verges. Residents affected are asked to contact the Police on 101. There is a current Government consultation regarding parking on pavements, it would be interesting to understand how other areas intend to deal with this issue.

**Parking outside of the School**

This area remains a concern, despite the improvement of road markings. It is necessary to ask the police to attend as dangerous parking could result in an accident. Discussions will also take place with the Headteacher regarding children being involved in producing posters.

The matter of rotten leaves on the pavement adjacent to the school was raised due the school walking bus and other pedestrians using the pavement in Stackyard Lane, which is slippery when in wet conditions due to the compacted leaf fall on the surface.

**Parking at Pipers Lane**

Another area of concern is Pipers Lane where parking on the pavement results in pedestrians having to walk on the road.

Councillor Bentley will take up the parking issues with Spt Jim Baker, WMP, too. It would be hoped that he would support fixed penalty notices.

**St Peter’s Primary School – Liaison Meetings**

Members agreed that there are a number of local topics that would benefit from a discussion with the Headteacher at the school and it was therefore agreed that the Liaison meetings should be reconvened as they have been useful in the past. These

meetings will be used in order that the Parish Council can raise matters, as can the school, for discussion by both parties with a view to ensuring the safety of the children and for the betterment of the Parish as a whole. It was agreed that the Parish Council will be represented by Councillor A Wilson, R Higginson and Y Brunger.
