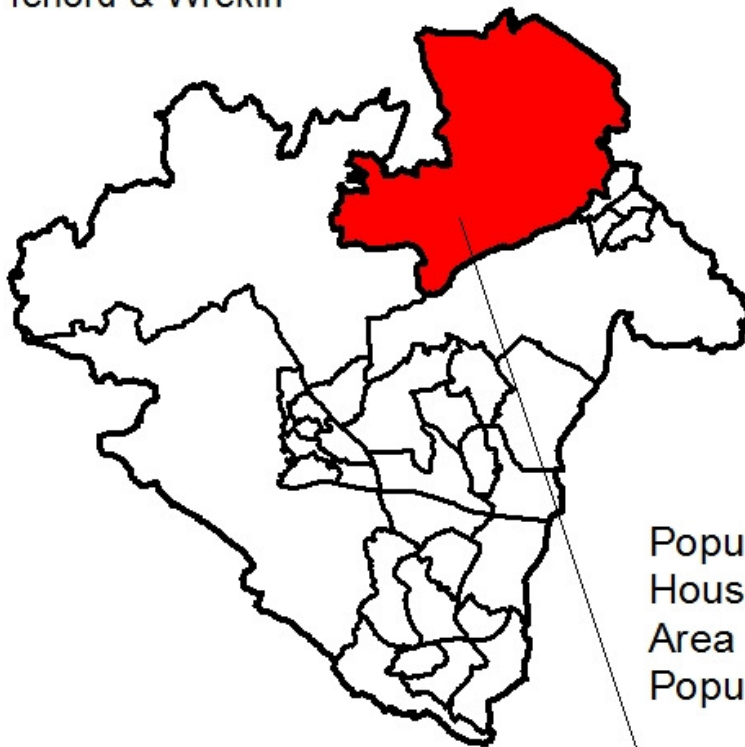
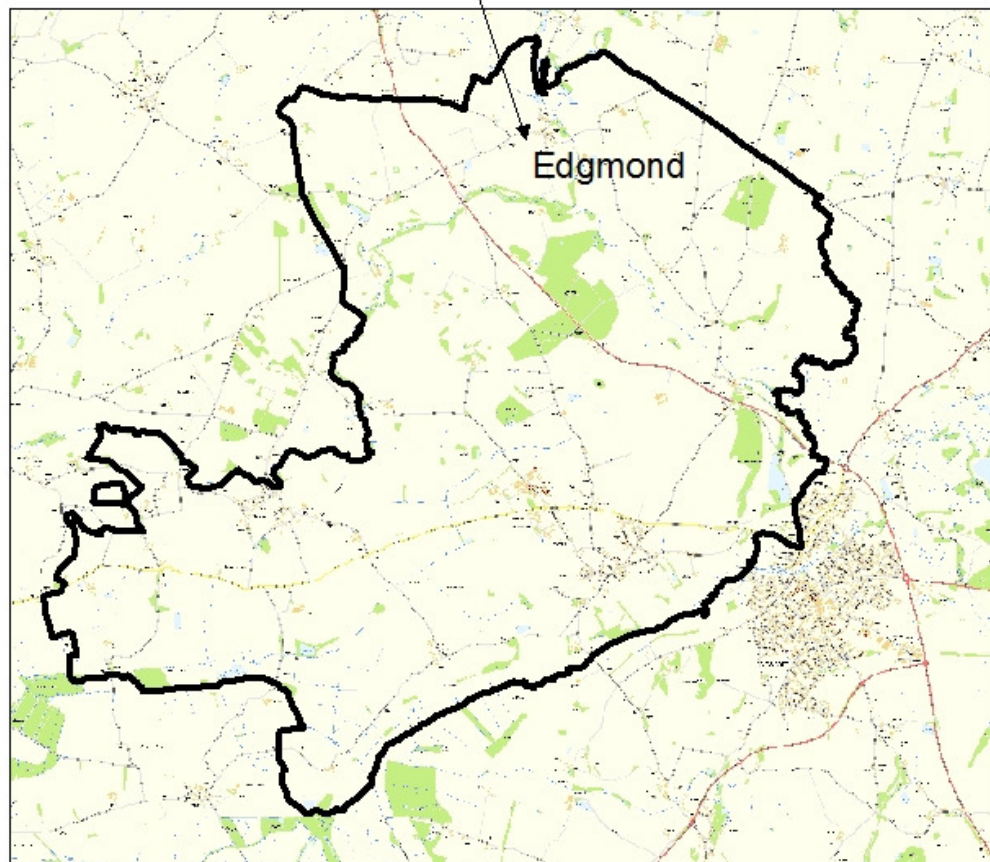

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1 Population Characteristics

Summary:

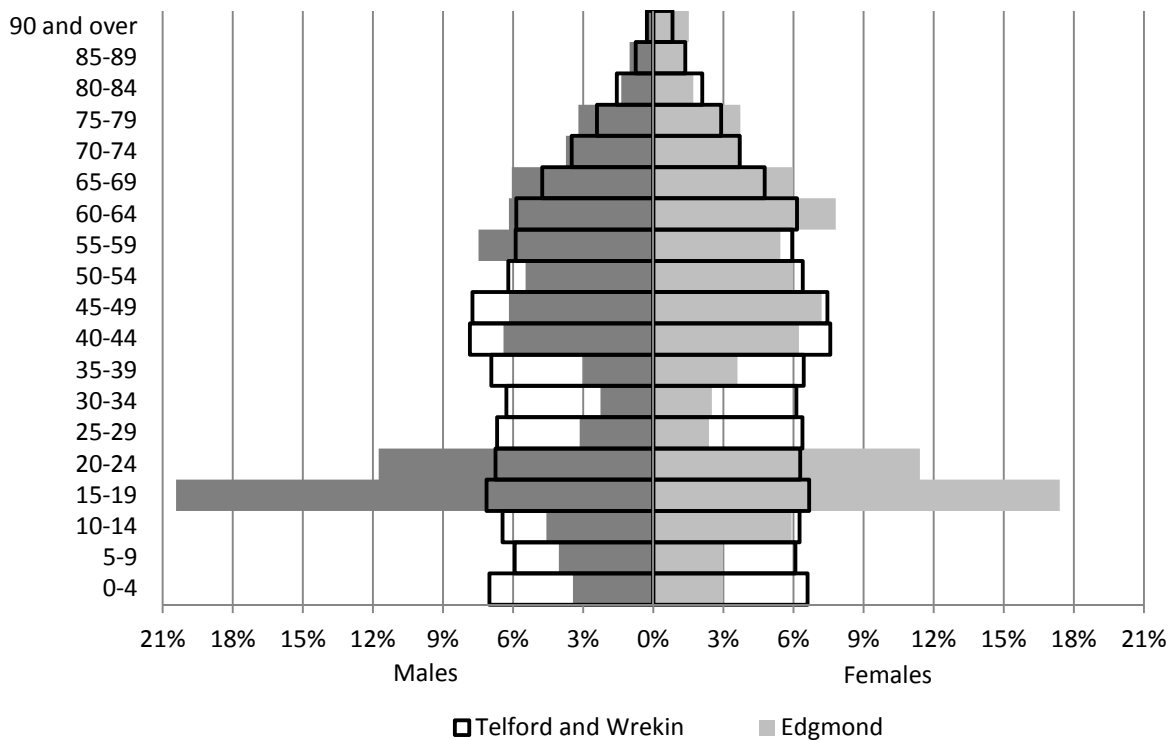
- Edgmond’s population increased by 4.5% between 2001 and 2011.
- In the ten years prior to the 2011 Census, the population aged 0-15 decreased by 7.1%, with those aged 16-24 increasing to 29.5% more than double the 12.1% Borough wide.
- The 25-44 and 45-64 cohorts decreased by 24.4% and 2.8% respectively, while the age groups 65-84 and 85+ increased by 26.5% and 55.6% respectively.
- Edgmond’s population is dominated by the 15-24 age group, due to the presence of Harper Adams University within the ward, with higher proportions than Borough wide.

2 Diversity

Summary:

- The BME population of Edgmond grew by 27.6% between 2001 and 2011, accounting for 4.9% of the ward's total population, more than half the Borough-wide rate of 10.6%.
- Since 2001, the Asian population has increased from no population to 2.4%. The 'Other White' population dropped to half the proportion seen in 2001.
- Even though the proportion of Christians decreased by 8.7%, higher than across the Borough (61.7%), it remained the largest religious group in the ward.
- For the first time in a census, people were asked for their main language. Out of the 3.0% of the population whose main language is not English, the majority can speak English well or very well (2.8% of the population), similar to the Borough-wide rate of 3.1%.

3 Household and family characteristics

Summary:

- The 2011 Census found 1,034 occupied household spaces in Edgmond accommodating 2,611 people, an average household size of 2.53.
- The predominant household type in Edgmond is married couple households with no children, 20.9%, the fourth highest ward rate across the Borough.
- Just 6.1% of households in Edgmond have no access to cars or vans, the second lowest rate of any Borough ward.
- Some 46.8% of households in Edgmond are deprived in at least one dimension, with just 0.1% deprived in all 4 dimensions.

4 Housing

Summary:

- The number of household spaces in Edgmond has decreased by 10 since 2001.
- More than half of the Edgmond's households (57.0%) live in a detached house or bungalow, the fourth highest ward rate in the Borough.
- A total of 80.4% of households in the ward own their house, with 46.9% owning their home outright and 33.5% owning with a mortgage or loan.

5 Employment and economy

Summary:

- The proportion of economically active population in Edgmond decreased by 1.3% between 2001 and 2011 and at 54.9% is below the Borough wide (69.4%).
- Although unemployment rate in the ward increased from 1.2% in 2001 to 1.5% in 2011 (one third of the Borough rate 4.7%), it is still the lowest ward rate in the Borough.
- One in ten residents of Edgmond (10.4%) have never worked, higher than the Borough rate of 7.2%.
- The proportion of 'managers, directors and senior officials' in Edgmond has fallen since 2001, from 18.3% to 15.8% with a corresponding increase in those employed in 'professional occupations'. Both of these occupational classes have greater proportions in the ward than Borough wide.
- More than a third of Household Reference Persons in Edgmond (34.1%) are classed as social grade AB - higher and intermediate managerial/administrative/professional, above the Borough rate of 18%.
- The proportion of people who drive a car or van to work has increased from 67.0% to 71.6% since 2001, and now it is higher than the Borough figure (70.0%).
- More than a quarter of residents in Edgmond (29.8%) have level 4 and above qualifications, higher than the 20.9% Borough wide.
- Some 26.7% of residents have level 3 qualifications, double the Borough figure.

6 Health and care

Summary:

- The majority of the Edgmond residents (85.8%) self reported good or very good health compared with the Borough (80.2%).
- Some 13.4% of residents felt their day-to-day activities were limited due to a long-term health problem or disability, lower than the 18.6% Borough.
- The proportion of residents who provided unpaid care decreased from 10.8% to 9.8%, slightly lower than the Borough wide rate of 10.8%.

Notes and definitions

Household deprivation

The 2011 Census categorises households on their deprivation across four dimensions

- Employment – Any member of the household aged 16-74 who is not a full-time student is either unemployed or permanently sick
- Education – No member of the household aged 16 to pensionable age has at least 5 GCSEs (grade A-C) or equivalent AND no member of the household aged 16-18 is in full-time education
- Health and disability – Any member of the household has general health 'not good' in the year before census or has a limiting long term illness
- Housing – The household's accommodation is either overcrowded (occupancy indicator is -1 or less) OR is in a shared dwelling OR does not have sole use of bath/shower and toilet OR has no central heating.

Household Reference Persons

HRPs provide an individual person within a household to act as a reference point for producing further derived statistics and for characterising a whole household according to characteristics of the chosen reference person.

- For a person living alone, it follows that this person is the HRP.
- If a household contains only one family, then the HRP is the same as the Family Reference Person (FRP).
- If there is more than one family in a household, the HRP is chosen from among the FRPs using the same criteria used to choose the FRP i.e selected on the basis of their economic activity, in the priority order.
 - Economically active, employed, full-time, non-student
 - Economically active, employed, full-time student
 - Economically active, employed, part-time, non-student
 - Economically active, employed, part-time, student
 - Economically active, unemployed, non-student
 - Economically active, unemployed, student
 - Economically inactive, retired
 - Economically inactive, other
- If some are all FRPs have the same economic activity, the HRP is the eldest of the FRPs, if some or all are the same age, the HRP is the first of the FRPs from the order in which they were listed on the questionnaire.
- If a household is made up entirely of any combination of ungrouped individuals and other related families, the HRP is chosen from among all people in the household, using the same criteria used to choose between FRPs.
- Students at their non term-time address and short-term migrants cannot be HRP.

Dependent children

A dependent child is a person aged 0-15 in a household (whether or not in a family) or aged 16-18 in full-time education and living in a family with his or her parent(s). It does not include any children who have a spouse, partner or child living in the household.
